Note 1. Corporate Information

IS Industry Fund Pty Ltd is a Proprietary company limited by shares that is incorporated and domiciled in Australia.

The registered office of IS Industry Fund Pty Ltd is located at:

The principal activity during the year of the Company was to act as trustee of Intrust Super under its Australian Financial Services Licence.

The financial statements have been authorised by the Board of Directors for issue on XXXXX 2017.

Note 2. Statement of Accounting Policies

(a) Basis of Accounting

The financial statements are general purpose financial statements that have been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standards, Australian Accounting Interpretations, other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board and the Corporations Act 2001.

The financial statements and notes of IS Industry Fund Pty Ltd comply with International Financial Reporting Standard (IFRS) and interpretation adopted by the International Accounting Standard Board (IASB).

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs, modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non-current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities. The financial statements are presented in Australian dollars, which are the Company's functional currency.

The accounting policies adopted are consistent with those of the previous year.

The company is a for-profit entity for financial reporting purposes.

(b) Adoption of new and revised accounting standards

No new and amended accounting standard and interpretations that are mandatory for the first time for the financial year beginning 1 July 2016 had any material impact on the current or any prior period and is likely to materially affect the future periods.

(c) Trustee Liabilities and Right of Indemnity

The Company acts solely as trustee of the superannuation fund. Assets are held in trust on behalf of members and other beneficiaries and liabilities have been incurred on behalf of the superannuation fund in the Company's capacity as corporate trustee.

The Company has a right of indemnity for liabilities incurred in performing its fiduciary duties as a trustee. The assets of the superannuation fund, which lie behind the right of indemnity, are not directly available to meet any liabilities of the company acting in its own right. There has been no breach of fiduciary duties during the year ended 30 June 2017.

The Net Assets of the Fund as at 30 June 2017 were sufficient to meet the liabilities as at that date.

(d) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Tax Office. In these circumstances, the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expenses. Receivables and payables in the statement of financial position are shown inclusive of GST.

Cash flows are presented in the statement of cash flows on a gross basis, except for the GST component of investing and financing activities, which are disclosed as operating cash flows.

(e) Employee Benefits

Provision is made for the company's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to reporting date. Employee benefits that are expected to be settled within one year have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled. Employee benefits payable later than one year have been measured at the present value of the estimated future cash outflows to be made for those benefits. Those cashflow are discounted using market yields on national government bonds with terms to maturity that match the expected timing of cashflow.

(f) Income Tax

The income tax expense (income) for the year comprises current income tax expense (income) and deferred tax expense (income).

Current income tax expense charged to the profit or loss is the tax payable on taxable income calculated using applicable income tax rates enacted, or substantially enacted, as at reporting date. Current tax liabilities (assets) are therefore measured at the amounts expected to be paid to (recovered from) the relevant taxation authority.

Deferred income tax expense reflects movements in deferred tax asset and deferred tax liability balances during the year as well as unused tax losses.

Current and deferred income tax expense (income) is charged or credited directly to equity instead of the profit or loss when the tax relates to items that are credited or charged directly to equity.

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are ascertained based on temporary differences arising between the tax bases of assets and liabilities and their carrying amounts in the financial statements. Deferred tax assets also result where amounts have been fully expensed but future tax deductions are available. No deferred income tax will be recognised from the initial recognition of an asset or liability, excluding a business combination, where there is no effect on accounting or taxable profit or loss.

Deferred tax assets relating to temporary differences and unused tax losses are recognised only to the extent that it is probable that future taxable profit will be available against which the benefits of the deferred tax asset can be utilised.

Where temporary differences exist in relation to investments in subsidiaries, branches, associates, and joint ventures, deferred tax assets and liabilities are not recognised where the timing of the reversal of the temporary differences can be controlled and is not probable that the reversal will occur in the foreseeable future.

(f) Income Tax (cont)

Current tax assets and liabilities are offset where a legally enforceable right of set-off exists and it is intended that net settlement or simultaneous realisation and settlement of the respective asset and liability will occur. Deferred tax assets and liabilities are offset where a legally enforceable right of set-off exists, the deferred tax assets and liabilities relate to income tax levied by the same taxation authority on either the same taxable entity or different taxable entities where it is intended that the net settlement or simultaneous realisation and settlement of the respective asset and liability will occur in future periods in which significant amounts of deferred tax assets or liabilities are expected to be recovered or settled.

(g) Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgements

The directors evaluate estimates and judgements incorporated into the financial report based on historical knowledge and best available current information. Estimates assume a reasonable expectation of future events and are based on current trends and economic data, obtained both externally and within the company.

Key estimates - Provision for impairment of receivables

The directors believe that the full amount of the debt is recoverable, and no provision for impairment of receivables has been made at 30 June 2017 (2016: nil).

(h) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts. Bank overdrafts are shown within short-term borrowings in current liabilities on the statement of financial position.

(i) New Accounting Standards and Interpretations not yet adopted.

A number of accounting standards, amendments to accounting standards and interpretations are effective and available for early adoption at 30 June 2017, and have not been applied in preparing this financial report. None of these is expected to have significant effect on the financial statements.

The Company has a right of indemnity from Intrust Super in respect of its liabilities, which have not been recognised in its financial statements for the year ended 30 June 2017. At reporting date, the assets of the Fund are sufficient to meet its liabilities, and there has been no breach of fiduciary duties of the Company in its capacity as Trustee.





Report on the Audit of the Financial Report
